HMS Beagle (1909) With the advent of the convoy system they were moved to the Second Destroyer Flotilla. In November 1914, as a response to a shortage of destroyers in home waters, Beagle was recalled to Britain, reaching Plymouth on 29 November, and being HMS Beagle was one of sixteen destroyers ordered under the 1908–09 Naval Estimates from John Brown & Company of Clydebank. The destroyers of the 1908–09 program would be the last coal-fired destroyers of the Royal Navy. With the Armistice she was laid up then scrapped in 1921. She and her sisters served in the First Destroyer Flotilla then were moved en masse to the Third Destroyer Flotilla and before the start of the Great War to the Fifth Destroyer Flotilla. there.
