As the disease advances, symptoms can include problems with language, disorientation (including easily getting lost), mood swings, loss of motivation, self-neglect, and behavioral issues. Although the speed of progression can vary, the average life expectancy following diagnosis is three to twelve years. The most common early symptom is difficulty in remembering recent events. Cognitive behavioral therapy It was developed by psychoanalyst Aaron Beck in the 1950's. moderate evidence of improved quality of life and daily living activity scores in those with dementia and MCI. This alteration in a person's thinking produces less anxiety and depression. This therapy focuses on challenging unhelpful and irrational negative thoughts and beliefs, referred to as 'self-talk' and replacing them with more rational positive self-talk. Cognitive behavioral therapy focuses on challenging and changing cognitive distortions (thoughts, beliefs, and attitudes) and their associated behaviors in order to improve emotional regulation and help the individual develop coping strategies to address problems. 15645f3120
