Filtration fraction physiology, the filtration fraction is the ratio of the glomerular filtration rate (GFR) over the renal plasma flow (RPF). Filtration coefficient A decrease in Kf due to reduced number of glomeruli or reduced permeability will reduce the GFR at a In physiology, filtration coefficient (Kf) is the product of a biological membrane's permeability to water and the surface area of the membrane. 5mL/min/mmHg, giving a glomerular filtration rate (GFR) of 125mL/min. Kf is frequently applied to the glomerular capillaries, which filter water into Bowman's capsule to form urine. Typically, in an adult human, the net filtration pressure is 10mmHg and Kf 12. giving a glomerular filtration rate (GFR) of 125mL/min. Typical units of Kf are mL/min/mmHg. The rate of filtration across the membrane is, by definition, the product of Kf and the net filtration pressure across the membrane. A decrease in Kf due to reduced number of glomeruli or reduced permeability will reduce the GFR at a given filtration pressure

Shrunken pore syndrome 2015 in which the pores in the glomerular filtration barrier are hypothesized to have shrunken so that the glomerular filtration rate (GFR) of 5–30 kDa Shrunken pore syndrome (SPS) is a kidney disorder described in 2015 in which the pores in the glomerular filtration barrier are hypothesized to have shrunken so that the glomerular filtration rate (GFR) of 5–30 kDa proteins, for example cystatin C, is selectively reduced compared to that of small molecules (less than 5 kDa) such as water and creatinine. The syndrome is associated with premature death. SPS has been identified in children 96b789bb4c

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Bowman's capsule A decreased GFR may be a sign of kidney failure Bowman's capsule (or the Bowman capsule, capsula glomeruli, or glomerular capsule) is a cup-like sac at the beginning of the tubular component of a nephron in the mammalian kidney that performs the first step in the filtration of blood to form urine. Fluids from blood in the glomerulus are collected in the Bowman's capsule. A glomerulus is enclosed in the sac. Specifically, the macula densa is found in the terminal portion of the distal straight tubule (thick ascending limb of the loop of Henle), after which the distal convoluted tubule begins 96b789bb4c
