Water Water, being a polar molecule, undergoes strong intermolecular hydrogen bonding which is a large contributor to its physical and chemical properties. Due

to its presence in all organisms, its chemical stability, its worldwide abundance and its strong polarity relative to its small molecular size; water is often referred to as the "universal solvent". It is a transparent, tasteless, odorless, and nearly colorless chemical substance. It is vital for all known forms of life, despite not providing food energy or being an organic micronutrient. The action of plate tectonics traps vast amounts of CO₂. Water is an inorganic compound with the chemical formula H₂O. carbon dioxide, early Earth's surface was much as it is today (in terms of thermal insulation). It is the main constituent of Earth's hydrosphere and the fluids of all known living organisms in which it acts as a solvent
