There are various methods used to execute a plot twist, such as withholding information from the audience, or misleading them with ambiguous or false information. Not every plot has a twist, but some have multiple lesser ones, and some are defined by a single major twist. It may change the audience's perception of the preceding events, or introduce a new conflict that places it in a different context. When it happens near the end of a story, it is known as a twist ending or surprise ending. A plot twist may be foreshadowed, to prepare the audience to accept it, but it usually comes with some element of surprise e1bf7ada07
