It can also be given through bypassing the airway, such as in ECMO therapy. can be dangerous. Acute indications for therapy include hypoxemia (low blood oxygen levels), carbon monoxide toxicity and cluster headache. Whether or not these effects are adverse to a patient Oxygen therapy, also referred to as supplemental oxygen, is the use of oxygen as medical treatment. It may also be prophylactically given to maintain blood oxygen levels during the induction of anesthesia. Supplemental oxygen can also refer to the use of oxygen enriched air at altitude.
