Tomoelastography Tomoelastography. It is an advancement of elastography in that it generates unmasked maps of stiffness and viscosity across the entire field of view that can be captured with a given imaging modality. Medical ultrasound and magnetic resonance imaging (MRI) are the most commonly used imaging modalities for elastography. Moreover Tomoelastography (from ancient Greek τόμος tomos, "slice" and elastography – imaging of viscoelastic properties) is a medical imaging technique that provides quantitative maps of the mechanical properties of biological soft tissues with high spatial resolution (called elastograms). hand, is a radiological imaging method that allows estimation of quantitative mechanical parameters of all organs and structures in the field of view. Classical elastography only measures stiffness in a limited region, such as at a depth of 6 cm in the liver or in a selected liver lobe, and thus cannot provide an overview of the adjacent tissues or organs
