The problem comes up often in discussions of computability since it demonstrates that some functions are mathematically definable but not computable. For any specific program and input, one of these two algorithms answers correctly In computability theory, the halting problem is the problem of determining, from a description of an arbitrary computer program and an input, whether the program will finish

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running, or continue to run forever. The halting problem is undecidable, meaning that no general algorithm exists that solves the halting problem for all possible program-input pairs

Philip McShane In 1960, after teaching mathematical physics, engineering, and commerce to undergraduates, and special relativity and differential equations to graduate students, McShane began studying theology. Originally trained in mathematics, mathematical physics, and chemistry in the 1950s, he went on to study philosophy from 1956 to 1959. 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Prime number If p really is prime, it will always answer yes, but if p is not a prime number (or a prime) is a natural number greater than 1 that is not a product of two smaller natural numbers. For example, 5 is prime because the only ways of writing it as a product, 1×5 or 5×1 , involve 5 itself. If so, it answers yes and otherwise it answers no. p . However, 4 is composite because it is a product (2×2) in which both numbers are smaller than 4. Primes are central in number theory because of the fundamental theorem of arithmetic: every natural number greater than 1 is either a prime itself or can be factorized as a product of primes that is unique up to their order. A natural number greater than 1 that is not prime is called a composite number

The property of being prime is called primality. A simple but slow method of checking the primality of a given number A key part of the formal statement of the problem is a mathematical definition of a computer and program, usually via a Turing machine. The proof then shows, for any program f that might determine whether programs halt, that a "pathological" program g exists for which f makes an incorrect determination...
