The school's first students travelled by horse-drawn van and benefited from qualified teachers and an expanded curriculum that

DU spectrophotometer This model of spectrophotometer enabled scientists to easily examine and identify a given substance based on its absorption spectrum, the pattern of light absorbed at different wavelengths. Beckman's National Technical Laboratories (later Beckman Instruments) developed three in-house prototype models (A, B, C) and one limited distribution model (D) before moving to full commercial production with the DU. Arnold O. Nonmetal Physically, they are usually lighter (less dense) than elements that form metals and are often poor conductors of heat and electricity. 1989, Chemistry: With Inorganic Qualitative Analysis, In the context of the periodic table, a nonmetal is a chemical element that mostly lacks distinctive metallic properties. Chemically, nonmetals have relatively high electronegativity or usually attract electrons in a chemical bond with another element, and their oxides tend to be acidic.
