Morphology (linguistics) Most approaches to morphology investigate the structure of words in terms of morphemes, which are the smallest units in a language with some independent meaning. Morphology also analyzes how words behave as parts of speech, and how they may be inflected to express grammatical categories including number, tense, and aspect. Phonological rules constrain the sounds that can appear next to each other in a language, and morphological rules, when applied In linguistics, morphology is the study of words, including the principles by which they are formed, and how they relate to one another within a language. For example, in English the root catch and the suffix -ing are both morphemes; catch may appear as its own word, or it may be combined with -ing to form the new word catching. constitute allomorphy. Usage-based models of language Broadly speaking, a usage-based model of. Rather, usage-based models posit that linguistic information is expressed via context-sensitive mental processing and mental representations, which have the cognitive ability to succinctly account for the complexity of actual language use at all levels (phonetics and phonology, morphology and syntax, pragmatics and semantics). It is declining in usage and was classified by UNESCO in 2010 as critically endangered, the highest level of language endangerment possible. It is not mutually intelligible with mainland Korean dialects. It is used in inflections to convey a grammatical function, such as plurality or intensification, and in lexical derivation to create new words. It is often used when a speaker adopts a tone more expressive or figurative than ordinary speech and is also often, but not exclusively, iconic in meaning.
