Victorian architecture Victorian refers to the reign of Queen Victoria (1837–1901), called the Victorian era, during which period the styles known as Victorian were used in construction. The name represents the British and French custom of naming architectural styles for a reigning monarch. (1837–1901), called the Victorian era, during which period the styles known as Victorian were used in construction. However, many elements of what is typically termed "Victorian" architecture did not become popular until later in Victoria's reign, roughly from 1850 and later. Within this naming and classification scheme, it followed Georgian architecture and later Regency architecture and was succeeded by Edwardian architecture. The styles often included interpretations and eclectic revivals of historic styles (see historicism). == Women's rights == da5aa71cd1 Trap shooting with live pigeons began in the U.S. around 1825, with the first recorded match balls containing feathers, then clay targets. Bogardus invented the first practical glass ball trap in 1877. Glass spheres, filled with feathers, were used as targets, much as clay pigeons are used today. They were called Bogardus balls. Women in the Victorian era The Victorian ideal of the Critical scholars have pointed to the status of women in the Victorian era as an illustration of the striking discrepancy of the United Kingdom's national power and wealth when compared to its social conditions. Representations of ideal wives were abundant in Victorian culture, providing women with their role models. Feminist ideas spread among the educated middle classes, discriminatory laws were repealed, and the women's suffrage movement gained momentum in the last years of the Victorian era. At the same time, women laboured within the paid workforce in increasing numbers following the Industrial Revolution. The era is named after Queen Victoria. the Victorians. Women did not have the right to vote or sue, and married women had limited property ownership da5aa71cd1

During Queen Victoria's reign, England enjoyed a period of economic and political growth along with technological advancement. Mass production of sewing machines for home use in the 1850s as well as the advent of synthetic dyes introduced major changes in fashion. Clothing could be made more quickly and cheaply. Benefitting from the Industrial Revolution, fashion changed more frequently, with more fundamental differences than it had in prior centuries. (The print, right, shows a remarkable diversity of styles for one century of dresses.) He died on March 28, 1913, in Lincoln, Illinois, and is buried in Elkhart, Illinois. da5aa71cd1 In the Victorian era women were seen, by the middle classes at least, as belonging to the domestic sphere, and this stereotype formed firm expectations for women to provide their families with a clean home, prepare meals, and raise their children. Women's rights were extremely limited in this era, losing ownership of their wages, their physical property excluding land property, and all other cash they generated once married. da5aa71cd1 Hart-Davis was born and brought up in Henley-on-Thames, the youngest child of the publisher Sir Rupert Hart-Davis (1907–1999) and his second wife, Catherine Comfort Borden-Turner. He was educated at St Andrew's Preparatory School, near Pangbourne, and then at Eton College, before reading chemistry at Merton College, Oxford. He then took a PhD degree in organometallic chemistry at the University of York and spent three years as a post-doctoral scholar at the University of Alberta in Canada. Subsequently, he worked at the Oxford University Press, editing science texts and chess manuals. In 2004 he was awarded an honorary degree (Doctor of Letters) by the University of Bath. da5aa71cd1

Bogardus and his sons went on to tour with Buffalo Bill's Wild West show. Victorian Railways The first railways in Victoria were private companies, but when these companies failed or defaulted, the Victorian Railways was established to take over their operations. Most of the lines operated by the Victorian Railways were of 5 ft 3 in (1,600 mm). Walton Evans arranged the supply of two 4-4-0 locomotives manufactured by the Rogers Locomotive Works of New Jersey, US to the Victorian Railways. Because The Victorian Railways (VR), trading from 1974 as VicRail, was the state-owned operator of most rail transport in the Australian state of Victoria from 1859 to 1983. However, the railways also operated up to five 2 ft 6 in (762 mm) narrow gauge lines between 1898 and 1962, and a 4 ft 8+1/2 in (1,435 mm) standard gauge line between Albury and Melbourne from 1961 da5aa71cd1

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
