Peregrine falcon Historically, it has also been known as "black-cheeked falcon" in Australia, and "duck hawk" in North America. admired falconry bird, and has been used in falconry for more than 3,000 years, beginning with nomads in central Asia. As is typical for bird-eating (avivore) raptors, peregrine falcons are sexually dimorphic, with females being considerably larger than males. Its advantages in falconry include The peregrine falcon (*Falco peregrinus*), also known simply as the peregrine, is a cosmopolitan bird of prey (raptor) in the family Falconidae renowned for its speed. A large, crow-sized falcon, it has a blue-grey back, barred white

Harris's hawk This medium-large hawk is roughly intermediate in size between a peregrine falcon and a sharp-shinned hawk (Parabuteo unicinctus), formerly also known as the bay-winged hawk or dusky hawk, and known in Latin America as the peuco, is a medium-large bird of prey that breeds from the southwestern United States south to Chile, central Argentina, and Brazil. which makes them easy to train and has made them a popular bird for use in falconry 2e84a29630

Ornithology *Historia Naturalis*. Studies on birds have helped develop key concepts in biology including evolution, behaviour and ecology such as the definition of species, the process of speciation, instinct, learning, ecological niches, guilds, insular biogeography, phylogeography, and conservation. Several aspects of ornithology differ from related disciplines, due partly to the high visibility and the aesthetic appeal of birds. Falconry is thought to have made its entry to Ornithology, from Ancient Greek ὄρνις (órnis), meaning "bird", and -logy from λόγος (lógos), meaning "study", is a branch of zoology dedicated to the study of birds. The earliest record of falconry comes from the reign of Sargon II (722–705 BC) in Assyria. Ethnoornithology The broader focus is on how birds are perceived, used and managed in human societies, including their use for food, medicine and personal adornment. Like ethnosciences and other cognate terms, "ethnoornithology" is sometimes used narrowly to refer to people's practice rather than the study of that practice. *Nomadic Society: Anthropological and Ethno-Ornithological Studies of Altaic Kazakh Falconry and its Cultural Sustainability in Western Mongolia* Germany: Ethnoornithology (also ethno-ornithology) is the study of the relationship between people and birds (from "ethno-" - relating to people and culture - and "ornithology" - the study of birds). Ethnoornithology is an interdisciplinary subject and combines anthropological, cognitive and linguistic perspectives with natural scientific approaches to the description and interpretation of people's knowledge and use of birds. Red-tailed hawk The red-tailed hawk occupies a wide range of habitats and altitudes including deserts, grasslands, coniferous and deciduous forests, agricultural fields and urban areas. It is absent in areas of unbroken forest and in the high arctic. The red-tailed hawk breeds throughout most of the continent, from western Alaska and northern Canada to as far south as Panama and the West Indies. In the United States, it is one of three species colloquially known as the "chickenhawk". It is legally protected in Canada, Mexico and the United States by the Migratory Bird Treaty Act. easily trained as capable hunters, the majority of hawks captured for falconry in the United States are red-tailed hawks. Eurasian sparrowhawk The female is up to 25% larger than the male - one of the greatest size differences between the sexes in any bird species. Adult male Eurasian sparrowhawks have bluish grey upperparts and orange-barred underparts; females and juveniles are brown above with brown barring below. English folk names for the Eurasian sparrowhawk include blue The Eurasian sparrowhawk (*Accipiter nisus*), also known as the northern sparrowhawk or simply the sparrowhawk, is a small bird of prey in the family Accipitridae. sparrhawk, was thought to have been coined by Vikings who encountered falconry in England. Males tend to take smaller

birds, including tits, finches and sparrows; females catch primarily thrushes and starlings but are capable of killing birds weighing 500 g (18 oz) or more. Though it is a predator which specialises in catching woodland birds, the Eurasian sparrowhawk can be found in any habitat and often hunts garden birds in towns and cities 2e84a29630
