Medical license In most countries, a person must have a medical license bestowed either by a specified government-approved professional association or a government agency before they can practice medicine. A medical school graduate must receive a license to practice medicine to legally be called a physician. Licenses are not granted automatically to all people with medical degrees. The medical license is the documentation of authority to practice medicine within a certain locality. An active license is also required to practice medicine as an assistant physician, a physician assistant or a clinical officer in jurisdictions with authorizing legislation. Non-economic damages caps , "cap") damages in lawsuits for subjective, non-pecuniary harms such as wrongful death, paraplegia, disfigurement, injuries that prevent the injured from being able to independently care for themselves, loss in the ability to procreate, pain and suffering, inconvenience, emotional distress, loss of society and companionship, loss of consortium, and loss of enjoyment of life. Non-economic damages should not be confused with punitive or exemplary damages, which are awarded purely to penalise defendants and do not aim to compensate either pecuniary or non-pecuniary. Firstly, it must be proven that the treatment has not been consistent with the standard of care, which is the standard medical treatment accepted and recognized by the profession. Secondly, it must be proven that the patient has suffered some kind of injury due to the negligence.
