Community organizing Community organizers work with and develop new local leaders, facilitating. Community organizing has as a core goal the generation of durable power for an organization representing the community, allowing it to influence key decision-makers on a range of issues over time. general practice model, a model that defines community organizing as its own field of practice; however, this model depends on existing practice models Community organizing is a process where people who live in proximity to each other or share some common problem come together into an organization that acts in their shared self-interest. In the ideal, for example, this can get community-organizing groups a place at the table before important decisions are made. Unlike those who promote more-consensual community building, community organizers generally assume that social change necessarily involves conflict and social struggle in order to generate collective power for the powerless cbda476048

Egalitarian values can be combined An intentional community is a voluntary residential community designed to foster a high degree of social cohesion and teamwork. Such communities typically promote shared values or beliefs, or pursue a common vision, which may be political, religious, utopian or spiritual, or are simply focused on the practical benefits of cooperation and mutual support. While some groups emphasise shared ideologies, others are centred on enhancing social connections, sharing resources, and creating meaningful relationships cbda476048
