These images are then analyzed for abnormal findings. Radiation exposure As of 2007, "medical radiation exposure" was defined by the International Commission on Radiological Protection as exposure incurred by people as part of their own medical or dental diagnosis or treatment; by persons, other than those occupationally exposed, knowingly, while voluntarily helping in the support and comfort of patients; and by volunteers in a programme of biomedical research involving their exposure. It is defined as the electric charge freed by such radiation in a specified volume of air divided by the mass of that air. Exposure can take place through X-rays, CT scans, and radiotherapy. measures. These imaging techniques use ion radiation to make detailed images of the internal Radiation exposure is a measure of the ionization of air due to ionizing radiation from photons. Common medical tests and treatments involving radiation include X-rays, CT scans, mammography, lung ventilation and perfusion scans, bone scans, cardiac perfusion

To calculate the value of stochastic health risk in sieverts, the physical quantity absorbed dose is converted into equivalent dose and effective The sievert (symbol: Sv) is a derived unit in the International System of Units (SI) intended to represent the stochastic health risk of ionizing radiation, which is defined as the probability of causing radiation-induced cancer and genetic damage. radiation exposure 4be794596e

Bone age In children, bone age serves as a measure of physiological maturity and aids in the diagnosis of growth abnormalities, endocrine disorders, and other medical conditions. As a person grows from fetal life through childhood, puberty, and finishes growth as a young adult, the bones of the skeleton change in size and shape. A comparison between the appearance of a patient's bones to a standard set of bone images known to be representative of the average bone shape and size for a given age can be used to assign a "bone age" to the patient. This method has the advantage of eliminating the need for additional radiographic exposure in cases where the vertebrae Bone age is the degree of a person's skeletal development. The barium enhances the visibility of the relevant parts of the gastrointestinal tract by coating the inside

wall of the tract and appearing white on the film. Although TMD is not life-threatening, it can be detrimental to quality of life; this is because the symptoms can become chronic and difficult to manage. thereby complicating radiographic interpretation. The most important feature is pain, followed by restricted mandibular movement, and noises from the temporomandibular joints (TMJ) during jaw movement 4be794596e
