It followed the cantata cycle he had composed from his appointment as Thomaskantor after Trinity in 1723

Bach's second cantata cycle is commonly used as a synonym for his chorale cantata cycle, but strictly speaking both cycles overlap only for 40 cantatas. Two further chorale cantatas may belong to both cycles: the final version of Christ lag in Todes Banden, BWV 4, and the earliest version of Ein feste Burg ist unser Gott, BWV 80; it is, however, uncertain whether these versions were first presented in Bach's second year in Leipzig. Bach composed a further 13 cantatas in his second year at Leipzig, none of them chorale cantatas, although... Marie de' Medici cycle Twenty-one of the paintings depict Marie's own struggles and triumphs in life. (See #Henry IV Cycle below) The Marie de' Medici Cycle is a series of twenty-four paintings by Peter Paul Rubens commissioned by Marie de' Medici, widow of Henry IV of France, for the Luxembourg Palace in Paris. Rubens received the commission in the autumn of 1621. The paintings now hang in the Louvre in Paris. After negotiating the terms of the contract in early 1622, the project was to be completed within two years, coinciding with the marriage of Marie's daughter, Henrietta Maria. 1625. The remaining three are portraits of herself and her parents. The cycle of paintings dedicated to the life of Henry IV was never completed, although some preliminary sketches survive
