Sucking blister Neonatal skin is extremely Sucking blisters are a cutaneous condition on newborns that is present on their extremities at birth. This process of elimination includes examining blood culture, lesions. These sucking blisters become present at birth when the sucking movements are very aggressive while in the uterus. It is difficult to diagnose because its appearance can be mistaken as other skin conditions. Sucking blisters are due to natural neonatal sucking reflexes on the affected areas in utero. These blisters are commonly found on the newborn's arms, fingers, or any body part they are able to suck on. Diagnosis is usually done by eliminating other possible cutaneous conditions. by the fetus forcefully sucking on an accessible area of their body, typically an upper extremity, but potentially toes as well. It is a very rare condition, seen in less than 1% of newborns. This is not to be confused with sucking pads, which are similar in appearance b1800e5d86
