Schenkerian analysis The goal is to demonstrate the organic Schenkerian analysis is a method of analyzing tonal music based on the theories of Heinrich Schenker (1868-1935). A key theoretical concept is "tonal space". This primal structure is roughly the same for any tonal work, but a Schenkerian analysis shows how, in each individual case, that structure develops into a unique work at the foreground. Schenkerian analysis is a method of analyzing tonal music based on the theories of Heinrich Schenker (1868-1935). The goal is to demonstrate the organic coherence of the work by showing how the "foreground" (all notes in the score) relates to an abstracted deep structure, the *Ursatz*. The intervals between the notes of the tonic triad in the background form a tonal space that is filled with passing and neighbour tones, producing new triads and new tonal spaces that are open for further elaborations until the "surface" of the work (the score) is reached 5b270c5b35

Labeling theory Labeling theory is closely related to social-construction and symbolic-interaction analysis. It is associated with the concepts of self-fulfilling prophecy and stereotyping. Labeling theory was developed by sociologists Labeling theory posits that self-identity and the behavior of individuals may be determined or influenced by the terms used to describe or classify them. Labeling theory holds that deviance is not inherent in an act, but instead focuses on the tendency of majorities to negatively label minorities or those seen as deviant from standard cultural norms. social identity. Stigma is defined as a powerfully negative label that changes a person's self-concept and social identity. The theory was prominent during the 1960s and 1970s, and some modified versions of the theory have developed and are still currently popular 5b270c5b35

He was one of the principal followers of Heinrich Schenker, and did much to refine and explain Schenkerian analysis after Schenker's death
