Surgical suture There are numerous types of suture which differ by needle shape and size as well as thread material and characteristics. Selection of surgical suture should be determined by the characteristics and location of the wound or the specific body tissues being approximated. Application generally involves using a needle with an attached length of thread. hold tissues in place without breaking. **Tissue reactivity:** A surgical suture, also known as a stitch or stitches, is a medical device used to hold body tissues together and approximate wound edges after an injury or surgery. **Elasticity:** the ability of the suture material to adapt to changing tissues such as in cases of edema fc554abd7b

Lymphedema The lymphatic system functions as a critical portion of the body's immune system and returns interstitial fluid to the bloodstream. fluid collects in the tissues. Left untreated, this stagnant, protein-rich fluid causes tissue channels to increase in size and number, reducing oxygen Lymphedema, also known as lymphoedema and lymphatic edema, is a condition of localized swelling caused by a compromised lymphatic system fc554abd7b

Though incurable and progressive, a number of treatments may improve symptoms. This commonly includes compression therapy, good skin care, exercise, and manual lymphatic drainage (MLD), which together are known as combined decongestive therapy. Diuretics are not useful. fc554abd7b **Organs** that have been successfully transplanted include the heart, kidneys, liver, lungs, pancreas, intestine, thymus and uterus. **Tissues** include bones, tendons (both referred to as musculoskeletal grafts), corneae, skin, heart valves, nerves and veins... fc554abd7b

Somatic cell nuclear transfer These cells genetically In genetics and developmental biology, somatic cell nuclear transfer (SCNT) is a laboratory strategy for creating a viable embryo from a body cell and an egg cell. The aim of carrying out this procedure is to obtain pluripotent cells from a cloned embryo. It is used in both therapeutic and reproductive cloning. In January 2018, a team of scientists in

Shanghai announced the successful cloning of two female crab-eating macaques (named Zhong Zhong and Hua Hua) from foetal nuclei. The technique consists of taking a denucleated oocyte (egg cell) and implanting a donor nucleus from a somatic (body) cell. In 1996, Dolly the sheep became famous for being the first successful case of the reproductive cloning of a mammal. focus of study in stem cell research fc554abd7b

Organ transplantation Tissues can be recovered from donors who have died from circulatory or brain death within 24 hours after cardiac arrest. Allografts can either be from a living or cadaveric source. Transplants that are recently performed between two subjects of the same species are called allografts. Organs and/or tissues that are transplanted within the same person's body are called autografts. The donor and recipient may be at the same location, or organs may be transported from a donor site to another location. Unlike organs, most tissues (with Organ transplantation is a medical procedure in which an organ is removed from one body and placed in the body of a recipient, to replace a damaged or missing organ fc554abd7b

The exact cause of leukemia is unknown. A combination of genetic factors and environmental (non-inherited) factors are believed to play a role. Risk factors include smoking, ionizing radiation, petrochemicals (such as benzene), prior chemotherapy, and Down syndrome. People with a family history of leukemia are... fc554abd7b

Teratoma nonseminomatous germ cell tumor. All tumors of this class are the result of abnormal development of pluripotent cells: germ cells and embryonal cells. Magnetic resonance imaging g Magnetic resonance imaging (MRI) is a medical imaging technique used in radiology to generate pictures of the anatomy and the physiological processes inside the body. MRI does not involve X-rays or the use of ionizing radiation, which distinguishes it from computed tomography (CT) and positron emission tomography (PET) scans. Compared to CT, MRI provides better contrast in images of soft tissues, e. MRI is a medical application of nuclear magnetic resonance (NMR) which can also be used for imaging in other NMR applications, such as NMR spectroscopy. hospitals and clinics for medical diagnosis, staging and follow-up of disease. Magnet therapy The field surrounding magnet therapy devices is far too weak and falls off with distance far too quickly Magnetic therapy is a pseudoscientific alternative medicine practice involving the weak static magnetic field produced by a permanent magnet which is placed on the body. might improve blood flow in underlying tissues. It is similar to the alternative medicine practice of electromagnetic therapy, which uses a magnetic field generated by an electrically powered device. Magnet therapy products may include wristbands, jewelry, blankets, and wraps that have magnets incorporated into them fc554abd7b

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
