Muscle memory "Associations of postural knowledge and basic motor skill with dyspraxia in autism: Implication for abnormalities in distributed connectivity and motor learning" Muscle memory is a form of procedural memory that involves consolidating a specific motor task into memory through repetition, which has been used synonymously with motor learning. This process decreases the need for attention and creates maximum efficiency within the motor and memory systems. When a movement is repeated over time, the brain creates a long-term muscle memory for that task, eventually allowing it to be performed with little to no conscious effort. Muscle memory is found in many everyday activities that become automatic and improve with practice, such as riding bikes, driving motor vehicles, playing ball sports, musical instruments, and poker, typing on keyboards, entering PINs, performing martial arts, swimming, dancing, and drawing 57c59608ff

F. Behaviour Research and Psychological behaviorism is a form of behaviorism—a major theory within psychology which holds that generally human behaviors are learned—proposed by Arthur W. Watson (1912), who coined the term "behaviorism", and then B. Behaviorism was first developed by John B. Skinner who developed what is known as "radical behaviorism". The theory is constructed to advance from basic animal learning principles to deal with all types of human behavior, including personality, culture, and human evolution. Staats 57c59608ff

However, if unable to do so the adult helps by also prompting the learner through the last step and reinforcement is given to the learner once the last step is completed.
