Gerolamo Cardano published them in his 1545 book *Ars Magna*, together with a solution for the quartic equations The history of mathematics deals with the origin of discoveries in mathematics and the mathematical methods and notation of the past. From 3000 BC the Mesopotamian states of Sumer, Akkad and Assyria, followed closely by Ancient Egypt and the Levantine state of Ebla began using arithmetic, algebra and geometry for taxation, commerce, trade, and in astronomy, to record time and formulate calendars.
