It emphasizes independence and it views children as naturally eager for knowledge and capable of initiating learning in a sufficiently supportive and well-prepared learning environment 3e442fd4f0

Childhood trauma They may also witness abuse of a sibling or parent, or have a mentally ill parent. Childhood trauma has been correlated with later negative effects on health and psychological wellbeing. Children may go through a range of experiences that classify as psychological trauma; these might include neglect, abandonment, sexual abuse, emotional abuse, and physical abuse. In children, level of functioning is operationalized as the child continuing to behave in a manner that is considered developmentally appropriate for Childhood trauma is often described as serious adverse childhood experiences. However, resilience is also a common outcome; many children who experience adverse childhood experiences do not develop mental or physical health problems 3e442fd4f0

There is also evidence that supports that those who are in lower socioeconomic populations are at greater risk of developing ECC. mutans) and Lactobacillus. ECC is characterized by the presence of 1 or more decayed (non cavitated or cavitated lesions), missing (due to caries), or filled tooth surfaces in any primary tooth 3e442fd4f0

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
